



Facts About The Super Jake Foundation

- The *Super Jake Foundation* was established in early 2005 in honor of “Super” Jake Robert Widman, who lost his year-long battle to neuroblastoma on May 27, 2005, at the age of 4.
- *The Super Jake Foundation* is a national 501c3 nonprofit organization dedicated to funding and finding a cure for neuroblastoma and to providing assistance to families with children with cancer.
- *The Super Jake Foundation* funds pediatric cancer research at childrens’ hospitals throughout the country and will assist cancer families at Children’s Memorial Hospital in Chicago, where Super Jake was a patient.
- To date, *The Super Jake Foundation* has raised more than \$300,000 through grassroots community efforts, including garage sales, raffles, and the annual “Super Jake and Friends Heroes Bash,” held annually on November 3, Super Jake’s birthday.
- *The Super Jake Foundation* is the only national foundation dedicated specifically to neuroblastoma research. The Foundation is also unique because the board directs and manages 100 percent of research dollars.
- *The Super Jake Foundation* is trademarked by a red cape in tribute to Super Jake’s love of super heroes and as a reminder of his heroic battle against neuroblastoma. Founders and volunteers frequently wear red capes to fundraising events and speaking engagements in Super Jake’s honor.
